Court Place Farm, the home of Oxford City F.C., is situated on the A40 which is the main circular around the city of Oxford.

If you are travelling from the North (Birmingham) then you will arrive in Oxford on the M40. At junction 9 you will need to turn onto the A34. Continue on the A34 and take A40 to Marsh Lane/B4150. Continue until you see a sign for Court Place Farm.

The railway station is just four miles from the stadium. On leaving the railway station proceed to bus stop 4 and get on the 14A. This bus will drop you at Horseman Close, 2 minutes' walk from the stadium



Sussex Women's Challenge Cup Winners 2017-18 Lewes Ladies FC was founded in 2002 as the women's counterpart of Lewes FC, a non-profit organization dedicated to advancing 100% fan and community ownership. They commenced their journey in the South East Counties football league and, over a decade, ascended through the ranks, securing promotion to the fourth-tier FA Women's Premier League in 2012 after an undefeated season.

In 2017, Lewes achieved a historic milestone by becoming the inaugural professional or semi-professional football club to equalize pay between its women's and men's teams through their Equality FC initiative.

The following year, in 2018, the team earned a position in the FA Women's Championship.

Their best league performance to date was clinching 5th place in the FA Women's Championship, the second tier, during the 2020–21 season.

Lewes suffered relegation last season after a defeat to title-contending Crystal Palace.

HEAD-TO-HEAD

Today will be just the second meeting between Billericay and Lewes, the first coming in the 1999-20 F.A. Cup Fourth Round and played at The Dripping Pan.

The match ended as a 1-1 draw, with Therese Addison scoring for Town, but the hosts won the penalty shootout 5-4.
